Welcome to Helen!

It is very exciting to welcome Helen Wolstencroft into our church family today. Helen was ordained deacon on Saturday at St Paul's Cathedral.

We also welcome members of Helen's family and friends this morning.

What is a Deacon?

Deacons share in the pastoral ministry of the Church and in leading God's people in worship. They preach the word and bring the needs of the world before the Church in intercession. They accompany those searching for faith, they assist in administering the sacraments; they distribute communion and minister to the sick and housebound.

Deacons are able to do baptisms, weddings and funerals, but they must be ordained priest before presiding over Holy Communion. Most deacons are ordained priest after their first year in Holy Orders.

Deacons wear their stole over their left shoulder, across the chest to the right side, where it is fastened.

When first ordained in the Church of England, everyone has to serve their title in a three-year curacy where they will gain practical experience working with an experienced priest.

Helen will work alongside Matthew, Rachel and Irene.
